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PRINCIPAL'S PERSONAL MESSAGE

The end of Term 2 is nearly upon us and it has been another busy couple of weeks with lots going on for our students. I am extremely proud of our students and the way they have responded to what they have been asked to do. There has been a significant improvement in student attendance, a decrease in late arrivals and improvements in uniform compliance.

There has also been a significant improvement in student behaviour in the playground and student engagement in the classroom. These are all areas that I would like to see students continue to work on as we head into Term 3.

There have been a number of exciting events happening over the past three weeks which highlight the dedication our staff have towards our students, as well as our commitment to further strengthening our connections with our Partner schools. We have been able to host a Premiers Sporting Challenge for the Primary schools with Corrimal HS students organising and running a variety of sporting activities and demonstrating outstanding leadership skills and abilities.

Corrimal HS has also played host to over 120 primary students from Bellambi, Corrimal East, Tarrawanna, Wollongong and Woonona Public Schools as they prepare for participation in this years' Southern Stars Arena Spectacular. Students have completed a whole day rehearsal with a second one coming up next week. This is a fantastic opportunity for our students to connect with the primary schools towards their performance in August. All students have expressed their enjoyment at being involved in this experience. I strongly encourage you all to purchase tickets for this years' show to support both Corrimal High School students as well as those students from our Primary partners. This year, we have 15 students involved in the performance with 12 in a mass dance performance, 3 in the disAbility performance and 1 in the Featured Vocal Ensemble, as well as one of our teachers choreographing a mass dance performance.

The recent Year 4 into Year 7 was a huge success with Corrimal staff and students presenting opportunities and experiences for the primary school students. This day gave a true taste of what life is like for students at Corrimal HS with a broad range of experiences available. Feedback from students and staff indicates a high level of engagement and enjoyment from this day.

I am very excited to let people know that the work our staff are doing within and outside of the school to support students is paying dividends with increasing amounts of positive feedback from members of the community. This is reflected in our anticipated enrolments for Year 7 2020 which have surpassed expectations thus far, and continue to grow. This is reflective of the increasing confidence that the community has in our school being the school of choice for local students. I would like to thank all of the staff for their ongoing hard work, and also thank the community for their continued support for our school. It is greatly appreciated.

As you will all know, there has been a lot of work taking place at our school at the moment. Please see below for an update:

- Home Economics upgrade One kitchen has been fully completed with the second scheduled to be complete by the end of the holidays.
- Integration concreting work has been completed in the main quad with additional integration concreting to commence in the Agriculture plot in the holidays. This will provide the opportunity for all of our students to have greater access to all of our facilities.
- The school hall is currently getting a complete roof replacement and over the holidays, all of the windows and external doors will also be replaced in the hall. This will lead into a

refurbishment of the back stage area of the hall to match in with the recent upgrade to the hall and front office foyer.

• Classroom audit has taken place – this is providing an opportunity for me to identify the rooms which are most in need of an upgrade. From this, I will be embarking on a schedule of improvement across the whole school to ensure that every classroom provides and engaging, inspirational and aspirational space for our students to learn.

These works are all part of my intention to improve the external aesthetic of the school to ensure that the school looks inviting for all members of the school community, as well as improving the learning spaces to further promote engagement and pride across the school

I would like to wish all of our students and community a safe and relaxing holiday break with time spent with friends and family. I hope that our students come back to school refreshed and ready to go for what is shaping up to be another busy term.

Successful applicants will be offered a place in the Enrichment class for 2020 which will provide extra and targeted learning opportunities of students to extend their learning outcomes.

TRANSITION TEAM



This term has been busy for the Transition Team, in particular, for Years 10 and 12. Across the term, students participated in the Year 10 Future Finders Day at UOW. This program allows students to attend several university sessions in interest areas to help students identify potential future post-school study options. Our students were excellent leaders and were able to get a lot out of the day.

Year 12 also participated in a Road to Success session, also hosted by our in2uni partners. The session provided valuable information regarding post-school opportunities, application dates and support available to students. This will help students better prepare for the transition from high school to post-school life.

Similarly, the Transition Team has made contact with Year 12 students who graduated in 2018 to follow up on their progress. This initiative involves making contact each term to discuss progress, support for applications and scholarships and connections to possible job applications. We are happy to hear from all our past students and it was wonderful to hear about your current successes and plans for the future.

NCCD COLLECTION
